

SIZE: 10-80 cm long.

**LEAVES:** Delicate, flat, thread-like, and numerous, 2-5 cm long and 0.3 mm wide. They narrow to a fine point at the tip and are bright green. There is one vein running from the base to the tip of the leaf.

**STEM:** Slender and highly branched. The fine branches are typically widely spaced. It grows from a creeping

underground stem (rhizome).

FLOWERS: Cylindrical greenish spikes (5-12 mm long) on flower stalks 5-25 cm long.

FRUITS: Egg shaped seeds, 2-3 mm long with three ridges running from base to tip, one of

which is much more obvious than others. NOTES: This

Small Pondweed

Habitat:

Similar species: Small Pondweed (Potamogeton pusillus) has wider leaves (0.5-2 mm) and up to 3 veins in each leaf. The center of the leaf has a clear line of cells (lacunae) running from the tip to the base. The very long flower stalks of Algaelike Pondweed distinguish this species from other pondweeds.
