


Distribution: NS, NB, QC, ON, BC

NS General Status Rank: Secure

NOTES: Often grows in large patches. Has a sour lemony taste.





Habitat:

Wetlands and lake, river, or stream shores.

Interesting point: This species has an unpleasant and pungent flavour. It is

known as Mild Water-Pepper because it lacks the peppery taste that is characteristic of other smartweeds.

Similar species: Dotted Smartweed (Polygonum punctatum) has white flowers, and the sepals and petals are dotted with small glands. Stout Smartweed (Polygonum robustius, page 22) is typically taller (up to I m), and robust with thick stems and white flowers. Marshpepper Knotweed (Polygonum hydropiper) is common and more weedy. Its flower clusters are more slender and the flowers are mostly greenish or whitish. All three species have a strong peppery taste.
